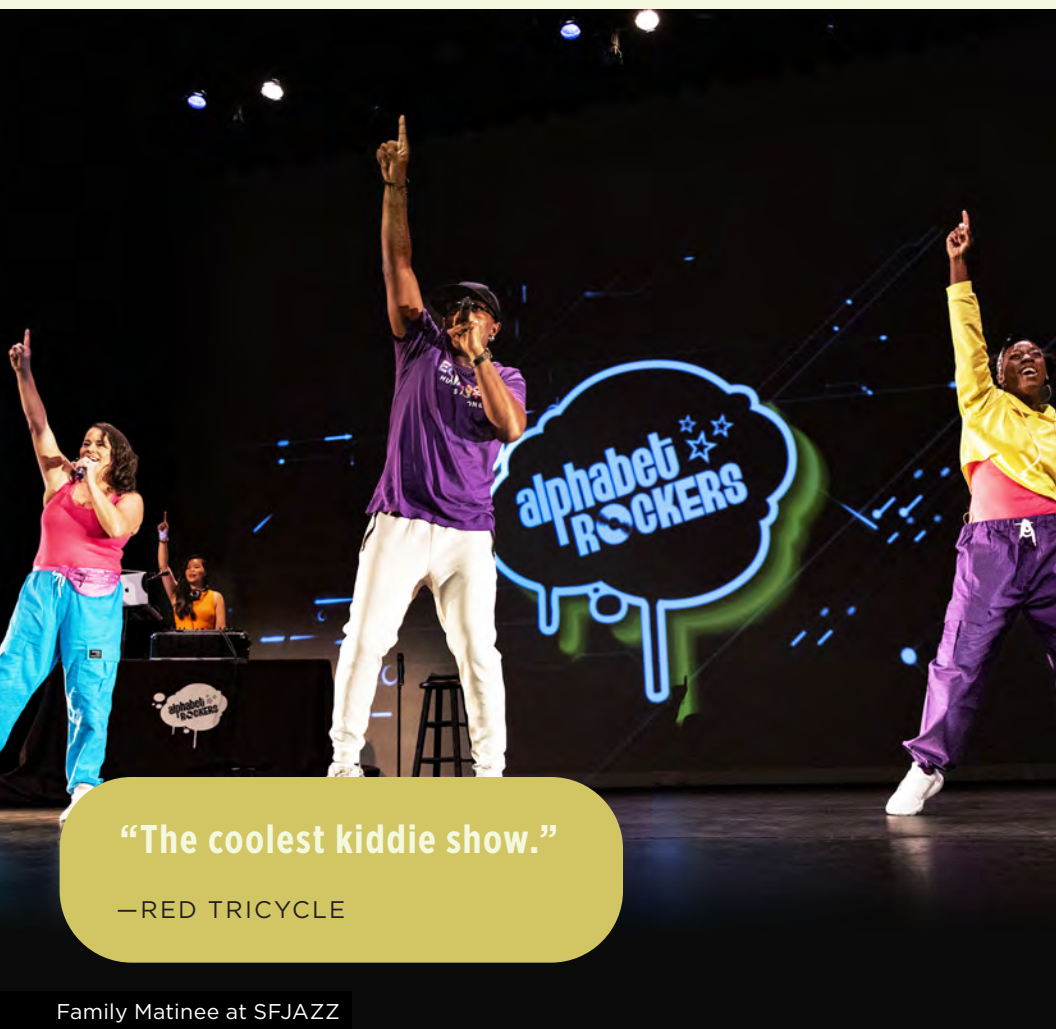

Live Looping

Utilizes creative writing and spoken word performance as a means to empower the next generation of Jazz Poets to interpret the world on their terms.

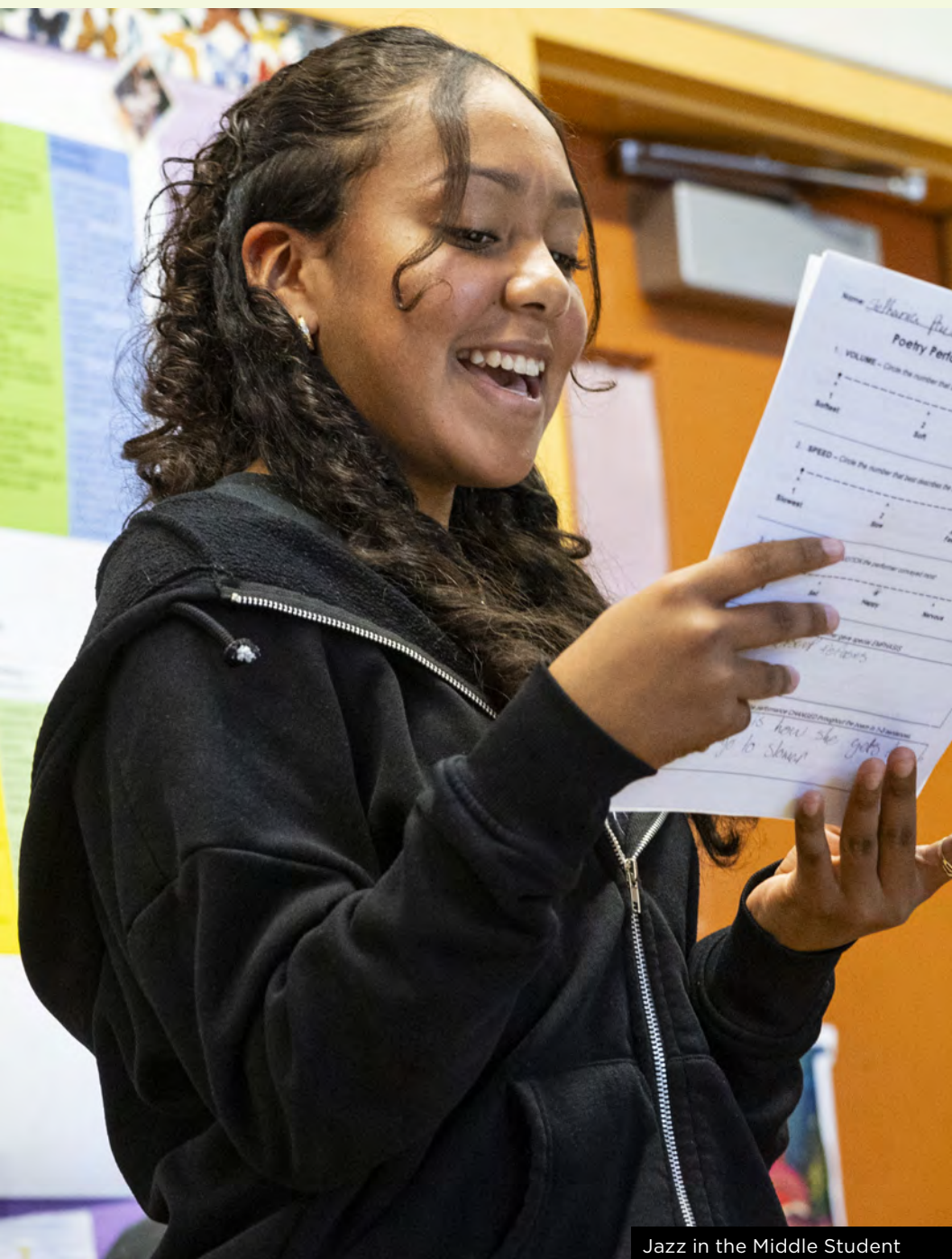
